

National seminar on Solar Waste Mgmt held

A DAYLONG National Seminar was organised here at Smt Narasamma College of Arts, Commerce and Science, Kiran Nagar, Amravati, on 'Solar Waste Management, itself Sustainable' sponsored by the Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR), a national organisation. The seminar was organised as a mandatory part of an approved project.

Dr Milind Barahate, Vice-Chancellor of Sant Gadgebaba Amravati University (SGBAU) inaugurated the seminar.

Dr Barahate in his inaugural speech said that it is necessary to solve various problems arising through current development for a healthy society and how it is necessary that these problems can be

solved on the basis of the human resource generated through higher education and adding to that asserted the need for society to be vigilant for that.

Tayde highlighted the importance of this problem by giving detailed statistics on how much solar waste will be generated in the next 15-20 years and its impact on society and the environment. Amit Arokar explained with examples how solar plates and their components can be classified and how their usefulness can be increased in various sectors.

Dr Kadu commented that we should be aware of the various problems that may arise from solar projects in the future and their management in potential projects. Bandhu, explained the relationship and connection between creation and destruction in traditional Indian society according to spiritual ideology.

In the second session, research papers were presented, in which Suraj Gawande, Director Preeti More, Amravati, Dr Bebi Kamble, Ahilyanagar presented research papers relevant to the topic of the seminar and emphasised the importance of this topic. The concluding programme

of the seminar was chaired by Shrikant Kalikar, trustee of the institute.
